
OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD - Boxes and Basic Supplies Available October 19th

We will once again be collecting shoeboxes for Samaritan's Purse's Operation Christmas Child program. Preprinted boxes will be available in the Parish Hall. Thanks to generous donors and a Thrivent grant, we also have basic school supply and hygiene items for you to take to help fill the boxes. You will only need to add the fun stuff – toys, flashlights, jewelry, calculators, etc. and the shipping costs (\$10). There are many ways you can help –

- Take an empty box and fill it and add the shipping costs.
- Donate some of the basic supplies. Our biggest needs are toothbrushes, hairbrushes, hair accessories, pens, pencils, pencil sharpeners, crayons, markers, note pads, coloring books.
- Donate cash or checks to help purchase supplies or for shipping. We have been able to pack some complete boxes using Thrivent cards. We need people to "adopt" these boxes by paying at least \$10 per box for shipping. Checks should be made payable to Samaritan's Purse with Operation Christmas Child on the memo line if you want them to go towards shipping or they can be made payable to St. John's with Operation Christmas Child on the memo line if you want us to use them to purchase supplies.
- Pray for the children receiving the boxes.

New this year - *Soap is no longer allowed* in the boxes due to customs regulations in some of the recipient countries.

Boxes will be due back no later than November 23rd immediately following the 10:30 service. If you have any questions, please call Dana Drum. Last year we collected 83 boxes. Let's try to bring our collection #'s up so that we can share the love and joy of Jesus with more children this year.
